OPENING RITES

Presider: Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ. (*or similar words*)

All: And with your spirit.

The cremated remains are sprinkled with Holy water, a reminder of the deceased's membership in the Body of Christ through baptism. The Easter candle reminds Christians of Christ's resurrection and his presence among us. A white pall is placed on the urn, a remembrance of the deceased's baptism signifying their dignity and having become a new creation in Christ.

Presider: Pray brethren, that my sacrifice and yours may be acceptable to God, the almighty Father.


All: May the Lord accept the sacrifice at your hands, for the praise and glory of his name, for our good and the good of all his holy Church.

Presider: All:	Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. It is right and just.





Priest: Behold the Lamb of God...supper of the Lamb.


All: Lord, I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof, but only say the word and my soul shall be healed.

We invite you to pray this prayer by St. Alphonsus de Liguori:

My Jesus, I believe that You are truly present in the Most Blessed Sacrament of the Altar. I love You above all things, and I desire to receive You into my soul. Since I cannot at this moment receive You sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart. I embrace You as if You were already there and I unite myself wholly to You.
